Our local mission-driven approach to serving our members has been a differentiator for Centene for decades, and we have strong relationships within the communities we serve.

Public policy affects our ability to fulfill our mission and purpose, meet customer needs and provide shareholder value. Centene has engaged and will continue to engage in public policy activities that improve the delivery of healthcare and positively affect our members, employees, and the communities in which we operate.

It is an important policy of Centene to advocate for our members and to advocate for improvements in the delivery and quality of the nation's healthcare system. Government regulation of the provision of healthcare products and services is a changing area of law that varies from jurisdiction to jurisdiction. Proposed changes to these laws, rules, and regulations can have significant effects on our healthcare system. Permitted political contributions and memberships in trade associations play an important role in Centene's public policy engagement efforts.

This Political Activity Report sets forth details about political contributions and advocacy efforts. Centene abides by all applicable laws and conducts business affairs in accordance with the standards and principles of ethical business conduct, both in letter and spirit. With a few exceptions, the significant majority of individual contributions made by Centene are for less than \$1,500. The publication of this report is consistent with Centene's commitment to acting with the highest standards of integrity, transparency and accountability.

Overview and Policy

Centene's purpose is transforming the health of the communities it serves, one person as a time. Our dedication to serving people is evident in our day-to-day operations. We understand the significance of the work we do and its impact on people's lives, and nothing is more important to us than conducting our business with honor, integrity and respect. Public policy affects our ability to fulfill our mission and purpose, meet customer needs and provide shareholder value. Centene has engaged and will continue to engage in public policy activities, including political contributions that have the potential to improve the delivery of healthcare and affect our business, employees and the communities in which we operate.

Centene primarily engages in public policy and politics in the following ways:

- Political contributions;
- Lobbying efforts; and
- Membership in industry trade associations.

This report details the political and public policy actions and expenditures that Centene undertook during the report period; as well as the measures that we took, and are taking, to ensure that we adhere to our policies and beliefs while engaging in the political and public policy areas.

Centene's Commitment to Integrity

Uncompromising integrity is one of our core values and serves as the foundation of our business conduct and daily operations. Centene adheres to the strict moral and ethical values set forth in the Centene Code of Conduct, without exception. We know that our future depends entirely on our reputation.

Centene's Commitment to Transparency and Compliance

Under Centene's Business Ethics and Code of Conduct, it is Centene's general policy that, through its employees, Centene will be transparent at all times and will transact business in full compliance with the law and in accordance with the highest principles of business ethics and conduct.

Centene believes that its interests are not served by any unethical practice or activity, even though such practices or activities may not be in technical violation of the law. Therefore, in addition to compliance with applicable legal requirements, Centene, through its Business Ethics and Code of Conduct, expects its directors and employees to adhere to ethical and professional principles when conducting business on behalf of Centene.

Centene's Board of Directors, through its Government and Regulatory Affairs Committee, oversees Centene's political activities, including corporate and PAC expenditures.



Political Contributions

In furtherance of our mission to serve our customers and communities, Centene supports political figures, parties, groups, and organizations that it believes can advance its goals. Centene makes political contributions through two primary avenues: 1) the Centene Corporation Political Action Committee, which we refer to as CentenePAC; and 2) corporate contributions.

All of Centene's political contributions, whether through CentenePAC or through direct corporate contributions, are made in accordance with all applicable federal and state laws. We also strictly adhere to our Political Contributions Policy and our Corporate Business Ethics and Code of Conduct when making contributions to ensure that all contributions are made in a manner consistent with our mission and purpose. Adherence to these policies is monitored at the board level by the Government and Regulatory Affairs Committee. Any political contribution made by Centene must be approved in advance by our office of the Executive Vice President of Government Relations which is responsible for ensuring compliance with law as well as coordinating input and advice from those with knowledge of the communities in which Centene operates. Additionally, for each contribution, Centene will require review and written approval by our Chief Executive Officer or, in certain circumstances, our Chief Financial Officer or Chief Legal Officer.

All political contributions reflect Centene's interests and not those of its individual officers or directors. No contributions are made in anticipation of, in recognition of, or in return for an official act.

Political contributions made by Centene and/or its PACs are reviewed by an external party to ensure compliance with federal and state laws and reporting requirements. An external party performs an annual compliance review to ensure adherence to Centene's government relations policies.



CentenePAC

CentenePAC is a federal political committee funded by contributions from Centene board members and employees. All contributions by members and employees and their families are voluntary, and Centene does not pressure or coerce employees to make personal political expenditures or take any retaliatory action against employees who do not. Centene has also established separate but related state political action committees in Missouri (Centene Missouri Federal PAC) and New York (Fidelis PAC), which are referenced collectively in this report as CentenePAC unless otherwise noted.

CentenePAC's contributions are made in furtherance of Centene's mission and purpose, and all contributions made by CentenePAC are reviewed and approved by the CentenePAC Board of Directors. CentenePAC's contributions are governed by Centene's Political Contributions Policy.

CentenePAC makes contributions on a non-partisan basis and the CentenePAC board analyzes several factors when determining to whom to make contributions. These factors include, but are not limited to:

- Candidate views and stated positions with regards to key issues to Centene's business and purpose;
- Committee assignments and leadership positions;
- Candidate viability; and
- Geographic concentration of Centene employees in a given district or state.

Lobbying

Centene is committed to helping people live healthier lives. As an industry leader in the healthcare system, we work in public policy to advance our goals of building healthier communities and our advocacy efforts are geared toward achieving these goals.

Centene believes it is necessary and appropriate to participate in the political process to further the long-term interests of our company and shareholders. Centene is committed to honesty and integrity, and complies with all federal and state laws and regulations for lobbying registration and reporting.

Centene's engagement with policy makers and advocacy on public policy issues is coordinated by our Government Relations department and our Government and Regulatory Affairs Committee of the Board of Directors. Our engagement is further guided by our Federal Lobbying Activities Policy and Corporation Business Ethics and Code of Conduct.

Information about Centene's lobbying activities, including contributions required to be disclosed under the Lobbying Disclosure Act, is publicly available on the <u>Senate website</u>. Centene also files appropriate lobbying reports with relevant state agencies in compliance with each state's requirements. These reports are publicly available in the jurisdictions. Centene employees engaged in lobbying activities and retained external lobbyists and firms, register as required by applicable law to represent Centene's interest.



Other Political Activity

Trade associations play an important role in our public policy engagement efforts and Centene belongs to many trade associations. While we do not always share or agree with all of the views espoused by such organizations, we believe they are often helpful for the purpose of building a consensus among organizations with similar interests and advocating in favor of those interests.

Certain membership dues to trade associations may be used to support lobbying activity, and trade associations are subject to public disclosure obligations with respect to their lobbying and political contributions and expenditures. Accordingly, information about trade associations of which Centene is a member, including contributions of those organizations that are required to be disclosed under the Lobbying Disclosure Act, is publicly available on the <u>Senate website</u>.

As part of its comprehensive government relations strategy, Centene also contributes to organizations that advance or affect our business, employees and the communities in which we operate, including political organizations organized under Section 527 of the Internal Revenue Code. We believe that by taking part in such organizations, we can help further the interests that are important to us and the communities in which we operate.
